



Arcadia Farm Field Trips

Overview for DC Schools

Arcadia Farm field trips are designed to connect students with where food comes from, while developing critical skills and meeting age-appropriate curriculum standards. Arcadia is a sustainable farm located at Woodlawn, a National Trust Historic Site in Alexandria, VA and it includes the Groundhog Garden, a half-acre space designed specifically for youth education.

After a field trip to Arcadia Farm, students will understand: 1) how to grow food sustainably with the natural cycles of the earth; 2) which fruits and vegetables are available in our region during different times of the year; 3) how farm-fresh food is different from processed or fast food; and 4) that fruits and vegetables are healthy and delicious!

Field Trip Schedule

At Arcadia Farm, students become farmers for the day! After students arrive on the farm we start with an introduction to sustainable food systems and a sensory scavenger hunt. Students then rotate through the following interactive stations in small groups:

- Incredible Edible Plants
- Pests and Pollination
- Superb Soil
- Funky Chicken Station
- Taste Sensation

Groups will eat lunch on the farm. Bring your own bagged lunches and we will provide water and picnic tables. Food harvested and prepared in the Taste Sensation Station will be served alongside lunch.

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How to Participate

- Fill out the [online registration form](#).
- After completing the registration form, mail in signed field trip contract.
- Have parents/guardians of participating students sign Arcadia health/photo release forms.
- Work with our field trip team to discuss logistics and customize trip to your class' needs.
- Arrange for bus transportation to and from Arcadia Farm.
- Provide the appropriate number of chaperones—at least one teacher or chaperone per 10 students, with a maximum number of 5 adults total.
- Have students fill out pre-test prior to field trip and a post-test after field trip. Return tests to Arcadia via addressed, stamped envelope provided.

Field Trip Costs

Field Trip costs are calculated according to the percentage of students eligible for Free or Reduced Meal Priced meals (FRP) and range between \$100 and \$400. All groups are required to send a \$50 deposit along with their registration contract to confirm their trip, which will be applied toward the field trip fee.
