FIELD TRIP OVERVIEW

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Arcadia Farm Field Trips are designed to connect students to where their food comes from, to develop critical skills, and meet age-appropriate curriculum standards.

Arcadia Farm is a sustainable farm located at Woodlawn, a National Trust Historic Site in Alexandria, VA. The farm includes the Groundhog Garden, a half-acre space designed specifically for youth education. At Arcadia Farm, students learn:

- **How to grow food sustainably with the natural cycles of the earth**
- **Which fruits and vegetables are available in our region during different times of the year**
- **That fruits and vegetables are healthy and delicious!**

FIELD TRIP SCHEDULE

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At Arcadia Farm, students are farmers for the day! We begin with an introduction to sustainable food systems and a Scavenger Hunt. Students then rotate through the following interactive stations in small groups:

- **Incredible Edible Plants**
- **Pests and Pollination**
 - **Superb Soil**
 - **Funky Chicken**
- **Taste Sensation**

Groups will eat lunch on the farm. Bring your own bagged lunches and we will provide water and picnic tables. Food prepared at the Taste Sensation station will be served from our on-farm salad bar to accompany your lunch.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

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- Fill out the registration form at arcadiafood.org/arcadia-farm-field-trips
- Mail in signed Field Trip contract and deposit after receiving your Field Trip date
 - Have parents/guardians sign Arcadia health/photo release forms
- Arrange for bus transportation to and from Arcadia Farm
- Provide at least one teacher or chaperone per 10 students, a maximum of 5 adults total
- Have students complete the pre- and post-field trip tests, and return tests to Arcadia Farm.
- Field Trips can accommodate a maximum of 60-65 students per trip.

REGISTRATION FEES

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Field Trip fees are calculated according to the percentage of students eligible for Free or Reduced Meal Priced meals (FRP) and range between \$250 and \$450. Small groups of 15 or less are charged a flat fee of \$150. A \$50 deposit is required of all schools with contract submission in order to reserve your date. The deposit will be applied to the trip fee.
